REMEMBRANCE DAY SUNDAY 10TH NOVEMBER

We are always so impressed by the huge numbers that join us on the Memorial Green on Remembrance Sunday each year. But, we need your help to continue this event. The police can no longer supply us with personnel to supervise the road closures and diversions necessary, so we need volunteers to come forward to stand at a number of key points from about 10.30am until the end of the Service, 11.30am at the very latest.

We have also bought a new PA system for use in the community which we hope will enable everyone to hear what is going on at the Service on the Memorial Green. This needs setting up beforehand and you will be given full instructions if you can volunteer to help with this as well. For those who are new to the town, there is a Church Service at St Michaels at 9.45am followed by a parade down to the Memorial Green and the start of a short Service there at about 10.45am including laying of wreaths and the 2 minute silence at 11am.

During the summer, we've had a new sound system installed, excellent for speaking and recorded music and we've upgraded our hearing loop system.

Our Toddler service on Thursday mornings has now been going for a year. We start at 9.30am with play, then songs, a story and prayers at 10.30am. That's followed by drinks and snacks and the children really enjoy the big space of the church building. It's a friendly group and we welcome new parents and carers, so do come along and

try us out: no charge but donations to cover the cost of refreshments are welcome.

Hundreds of people joined the Woburn Sands Band at a special event where they were presented with The Queens Award for Voluntary Service.

The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, the equivalent of an MBE for volunteer groups, was presented to Len Jenkins, Chairman of the Woburn Sands Band, by HM Lord Lieutenant of Bedfordshire Helen Nellis, on Wednesday 4th September at The Christian Centre in Milton Keynes.



Over 200 people, including past and present band members, the High Sheriff of Bedfordshire, local dignitaries, representatives from the local schools and other distinguished guests attended the presentation. Guests were treated to a performance from the youth band on arrival and, after the formal presentation which included a speech from the President/Chair of Trustees William Meads, the "A Band" put on a stunning performance with a selection of music from their very wide and varied repertoire.

Len Jenkins said: "We are truly honoured that the Woburn Sands Band has been recognised by HM The Queen and we thank the volunteers for their commitment over the years which has made this award possible".

After presenting the award, HM Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire Helen Nellis said "I was delighted for the Woburn Sands Band when they were awarded the Queens Award for Voluntary Service. This is an amazing achievement and a true testament to the outstanding contribution this volunteer-led group have made within the community. It was a real pleasure to present the award to the group on behalf of HM The Queen and it was a delight to see the pride shared amongst the Band members. I offer my sincerest congratulations to all involved"



TOILET OR TRAFFIC WARDEN?

The Town Council has been considering the use and cost of the public toilet on the Memorial Green recently. Many years ago when a very ancient toilet block run by Milton Keynes Council was taken down from the Memorial Green, we had a new toilet installed at considerable expense, largely because the shops in the High Street felt a public toilet was needed. However, the cost of maintaining it is £13,000 per annum and we have been looking at alternative uses of that money. One of the main complaints of residents over the past few years has been illegal parking on double yellow lines and over staying parking limits on the High Street. Our allocated visits of a traffic warden from Milton Keynes Council are fairly limited

and we have considered hiring our own part time traffic warden to tackle this problem. The cost roughly equates to that of running the Public Toilet. We sought the views of the businesses in the High Street on this and the majority of responses came back in favour of replacing the toilet with an increased number of traffic warden visits so that spaces on the High Street may be more readily available for shoppers.

So, be warned: don't park on double yellow lines, don't park obstructing the pavement and adhere to time limits on High Street parking because there will soon be a traffic warden around far more often!

WOBURN SANDS FRUIT / VEG / PLANT GIVEAWAY & SCARECROW TRAIL

Many of you are aware of all the events which take place in Woburn Sands in the run up to Christmas each year, but for newcomers to our community and as a refresher to everyone else, here's just some of the main events for you to savour and enjoy:

We start with the **Annual Christmas Fayre** on **Sunday 24th November** from 1.00pm. Santa will be in town with quality gifts for those visiting him. The fun fair will occupy the High Street and numerous stalls selling refreshments, crafts and more will be in the Memorial Hall and on the pavement. The Woburn Sands Band will be playing and the town will be buzzing! Profits from the day go towards the costs of the Christmas lights of the lamp posts (shared with the Town Council) and a donation this year will be made to Love Woburn Sands for the Community Transport project.

St Michael's, our parish church, is hosting the biennial **Christmas Tree Festival** from **Friday 6th to Sunday 8th December** when the church will be full of trees decorated by many of the organisations and clubs in our community. Do drop in to see the wonderfully innovative decorated trees.

Saturday 7th December, 10am-2pm, will see our **Christmas Community Market** with many festive goodies for sale in the High Street around the Institute and on the Memorial Green and no doubt some seasonal music.

At **4pm** on **Sunday 8th December** there will be a short **Christingle** service at St Michael's held amongst the Christmas trees and very suitable for small children as a creche and toys will be available.

Calling all book lovers. Did you know that the library operates a number of local book groups? The maximum membership per group is 10 and the one which meets on the second **Tuesday of every month at 6pm** currently has a vacancy. It will measure the heart rhythm before allowing you to administer an electric shock. Prompt action can be a life saver and it is fully endorsed by Asplands Medical Centre. We are very grateful to local company Storm Solutions for sharing the costs of this with the Town Council. We hope to install a second defibrillator at the new sports hall when built next to the Summerlin Centre and if you feel able to contribute to funding this, please contact the Town Clerk
