EDGEWICK FARM

We received some unwarranted press in a recent edition of The Citizen when it was reported that a sheep had been mauled to death by someone's dog on Edgewick farm. That much was true and the dog owner had immediately rung the Town council to tell us. He then contacted the owner of the sheep who was very understanding and we asked the Friends of Edgewick Farm to check the fencing around the



three fields which form the farm and in particular in the area where the dog got into the field. This was done and contrary to the Citizen report, no holes or gaps were found. The dog concerned was a large one and obviously clambered over the fencing where it had been slightly damaged possibly by one of the cows last year leaning against it. The Citizen were informed of the error in the initial report, but unfortunately went ahead with their incorrect article.

It is important that we have animals grazing the fields in succession in order to maintain it as natural grassland. The Dexter cattle who have grazed the area in previous years come from a farm in Great Brickhill which is in Beds and new Government regulations would require these animals to be TB tested before they could be brought onto Milton Keynes, Bucks, land, at a prohibitive cost and clearly unviable. We have had sheep here before until a resident persistently complained to the owner over a cold winter with snow, that it was cruelty to animals to keep them outside: the farmer was understandably annoyed and will not return his sheep now. We very much hope that now the fences have all been checked, the owner of the flock which was grazing for a few days this year will consider returning her flock, but we do need your co-operation. It is vital that all dogs being walked near fields with animals grazing are kept absolutely under control.

TWO IMPORTANT CONSULTATIONS

Hopefully you will get this newsletter in time to be informed of two consultations coming up on Wed 8 and Thurs 9 July. **The one on the 8th is in the Memorial Hall and is being organised by Gallaghers the house developers.** It will be an informal drop in session where you can see the latest plans for the major house building programme to the north of Wavendon, mostly east of the A5130, Newport Road, and south of the A421. This forms part of the 3000 homes of the SLA. Clearly it will impact upon us here, but this decision has been made and insisted upon by an Inspector, so now we are merely concerned with the layout and in particular the access points onto the A5130 as well as the accessibility of the new secondary school which will be built there and will serve Woburn Sands pupils in the future. The drop in session lasts from 2pm-6pm.

The second on Thurs 9 July on the future management of libraries is a discussion in the library on the future management of Library services in Milton Keynes. You will have read about the financial cutbacks which mean the library service has to make considerable savings. This meeting will be from 6-7pm in the library and will enable you to listen to the proposals for maintaining our libraries and for you to put forward your ideas and perhaps explore ways to get involved and make a contribution. We do, already, of course, have a small body of volunteers who keep our library here open beyond the normal hours allowing you to use the library on Tuesday evenings from 6-8pm in the summer months and 6-7pm in the winter ones.

The work currently going on to the library exterior is to attempt to eradicate the damp problem which is occurring in some parts of the library inside. New ventilation will be installed via ducts in a trench around the library exterior. The paint work has been removed from the lower part of the walls to allow the bricks to breathe. It will be cleaned up shortly.. Some work will also be done on the roof and if all this doesn't solve the problem over time, we will have to carry out more drastic works affecting the interior. The payment for all these works is being negotiated between the Town Council and Milton Keynes Council who carried out the refurbishment of the Institute in preparation for the opening of the library here.

POST OFFICE NEWS

It will be modernised and refurbished and offer longer opening hours, but the downside is that it will be closed from Wednesday 8 July onwards until the grand reopening on Thursday 23 July at 13.00 hours. Once reopened the post office will be open every day, except Sundays, from 09.00-17.30hrs.
